# The 2018 29er Canadian Championships at the Kingston Yacht Club

## August 3 - 6/2018

# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in 2017-2020 *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RSS) and the current 29er Class Rules.
- 1.2. The Organizing Authority for this regatta is The Kingston Yacht Club (KYC) in conjunction with the Canadian 29er Association.
- 1.3 The prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply.
- 1.4 These Sailing Instructions take precedence over the NOR.

## 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board, the southwest window of KYC.

## 3. ELIGIBILITY and ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is only open to 29ers.
- 3.2 Participants must be members of the 29er Class Association.
- 3.3 Eligible boats must have completed the registration process, and have paid their entry fee.

# 4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 (unless something arises from the skipper's meeting) on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

## 5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the RC boat, while it is docked at the KYC gas dock.
- 5.2 Code Flag AP with two horns(one when lowered) means that racing is postponed (stay on shore), no warning will be made less that 30 minutes after the AP is lowered.
- 5.3 Code Flag B fully hoisted with one horn means protest time has begun. When lowered with two horns means that Protest time has ended.

## 6. SCHEDULE for REGATTA

- 6.2 Up to 5 races a day.
- 6.3 A maximum of 16 races will be sailed.
- 6.4 No warning signal will be made after 1400 on Monday August 6<sup>th</sup>.

## 7. RACING AREA

The racing area will be to the south of KYC.

## 8. THE COURSE

The course will be a double windward leeward. See course diagram. Target times are 25 - 30 minutes.

### 9. MARKS

Marks W, LS and LP will be orange inflatable marks.

# 10. THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26. The start line will be between the RC Flag on the main mast of the RC boat and the port end starting mark.
- 10.2 Class Flag: 29er Red 29er on white background.

#### 11. CHANGE OF COURSE

Course changes will be made in accordance with RRS 33, the new mark will be green.

## 12. THE FINISH

12. 1 The finishing line will be between the mast of the RC boat, left to starboard and the finish mark, left to port.
12.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish.

## 13. ABANDONMENT

The time limit for the first boat to finish will be 60 minutes. The RC will abandon any race it judges to be an unsatisfactory test of sailing skill.

### 14. PENALTY SYSTEM

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

# 15. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1 Protest forms are available from the race committee.
- 15.2 Protests and requests for redress shall be delivered to the RC within the appropriate time limit, 60 minutes after the RC boat displays Code Flag B.
- 15.3 Protest Schedule will be posted as soon as possible after the protest time has expired.

## 16. COACHES and COACH BOATS:

Coaches must register with the regatta organizers when they arrive at KYC. Coaches are expected to monitor the safety channel on their VHF radios and be available to assist in an emergency. Coaches are to stay outside of the race course are (outside the diamond) during races.

### 17. SCORING

16.1 The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A2, will be used except as modified below.

Boats not finishing within the time limit will be awarded points for Number of Finishers plus 2.

16.2 One race will constitute a series.

16.3 There will be one throw out when five or more races are completed.

### 18. SAFETY

- 17.1 Life jackets shall be worn at all times while racing. Failure to do so will result in a DSO.
- 17.2 Each competitor must check in with the RC before the first race of each day. Failure to do so will result in a DSO.
- 17.3 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

### 19. TRASH DISPOSAL

Boats shall not put trash in the water. Trash may be placed aboard support and race committee boats.

# 20. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 29ers, top all female team and top youth team (16 and under).

# 21. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority wil not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
