**NOTICE OF RACE**  
**Amended 2018-07-09**

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2017-2020.
- 1.2. Canadian prescriptions to rules 61.2 and 67 shall apply. These are stated in full below.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1. The regatta is open to monohull boats included in the PHRF-LO classes listing or a monohull one-design class which has valid PHRF certification.
- 2.2. To be recognized as a One Design class there will be 5 boats of that class registered. However, for purposes of fair racing the Organizing Authority may create a one-design division with less than 5 boats.

3. FEES

- 3.1. It is expected that entrants will register on-line at [www.EYC2018.ca](http://www.EYC2018.ca)
- 3.2. The registration fee is \$95 + HST CA\$ for boats from EYC member clubs, if registration is completed prior to midnight on June 29, 2018.
- 3.3. Boats registering after midnight on June 29, 2018 will pay an additional 'late fee' of \$40 + HST CA\$.
- 3.4. Boats from non-EYC member clubs will pay an additional fee of \$15 + HST CA\$.
- 3.5. ~~Registrations will be accepted until close of Regatta Check-in on July 11, 2018, providing the proper fee is paid.~~ Due to the high response for this year's 2018 EYC Regatta we have had to close out Registration as of Monday July 09, 2018
- 3.6. Additional services and privileges will be outlined at the EYC 2018 site [www.EYC2018.ca](http://www.EYC2018.ca)

4. SCHEDULE

- 4.1. Regatta Check-in/Registration: Wednesday July 11<sup>th</sup> from 1400hrs to 2100hrs.
- 4.2. Racing: Number of races:

Date	All Divisions
Thursday, July 12, 2018	Long Distance Race
Friday, July 13, 2018	Course racing
Saturday, July 14, 2018	Course racing
- 4.3. There will be one (1) Long Distance Race and up to five (5) Course Races.
- 4.4. The scheduled time of the first Warning Signal for each day is 1000 Hrs.

5. MEASUREMENT

- 5.1. Each boat shall produce a valid PHRF-LO rating certificate. For One-Design class boats, proof of membership in the class association and proof of class measurement will be required. A boat may not compete for the overall trophy without a valid PHRF certificate.
- 5.2. A copy of rating and/or measurement certificates must be submitted at Regatta Check-in.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available on-line on the [www.EYC2018.ca](http://www.EYC2018.ca) no later than July 6, 2018 and at Regatta Check-in.

7. VENUE

- 7.1. The long distance will be held in and around Kingston Harbour.
- 7.2. Course racing will be held in Kingston Harbour off the Kingston Yacht Club.

8. THE COURSES

- 8.1. The Long Distance course will be between 15 and 30 nautical miles in length.
- 8.2. Course races will be windward-leeward, with a gate and an offset, with the number of legs to be determined by the race committee.

9. PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1. For all the classes rules 44.1 and 44.2 will be changed so that only one turn penalty is required.

## 10. SCORING

10.1. The scoring system is as follows: Scoring shall be in accordance with Appendix A4 (RRS) Low Point System.

10.2. One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

10.3. When fewer than 5 races have been completed in the course racing, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

10.4. When 5 races have been completed in course racing, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score course racing score

10.5. Scoring for Overall awards may include all completed races.

## 11. BERTHING

11.1. Boats shall be kept at the Kingston Yacht Club as assigned by the KYC Harbour Master.

## 12. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

12.1. Keelboats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

## 13. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

13.1. Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keel boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

## 14. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

14.1. A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

14.2. The Race Committee will operate on VHF channel 72 (INT).

## 15. PRIZES

15.1. Prizes will be given as follows: Trophies will be determined and awarded in accordance with the EYC Committee requirements. Divisional awards will also be presented.

## 16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. All participants will be required to sign a waiver of liability form.

## 17. INSURANCE

17.1. Each participating boat shall present proof of valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of three hundred thousand dollars US per event or the equivalent.

## 19. SAIL CANADA PRESCRIPTIONS 2017–2020

19.1. Rule 61.2 – Protest Contents

Sail Canada prescribes that no fee shall be charged for delivering a protest or a request for redress

19.2. Rule 67 – Damages

Sail Canada prescribes that a boat that has been found by a protest committee to have broken a rule and caused damage shall be considered at fault for the purposes of rule 67.
